ANNUAL MEETING SET FOR DECEMBER 20TH (by Randy Pratt)

This year's annual meeting will be held on Wednesday the 20th of December at the Viking Lodge. In an effort to plan ahead and bring consistency to our ACS group, your Executive Board has set future annual meetings to coincide with our December Luncheon.

On the agenda for this meeting will be:

1. **The announcement of the Executive Board members for the coming year** and
2. **Election results for three proposed changes to the Association's by-laws.** These changes are the ones first discussed, with a straw-vote agreement to continue, in June and again in September:
 1. Amend the by-laws to increase our annual dues to \$10.00 and lifetime membership to \$100.00.
 2. Amend the by-laws to extend membership to those federal employees still employed at NGA who have attained the minimum age of 55.
 3. Amend the by-laws to extend "Associate" membership to interested individuals who have not been employed at NGA or its predecessor organizations. These associate memberships will be renewable on an annual basis at the current annual dues rate and will grant the associate member all the privileges of regular membership except in the conduct of official business. An example of Associate Membership would be the players in the golf league who pay their annual dues to play golf with our group, but are not included in luncheons, or receiving the newsletters, etc. These are people who were not former employees of NGA or its predecessor organizations, but who have camaraderie with our group, borne of association with our members in the golf league.

A ballot for each member is enclosed with instructions to mail in your vote either supporting these amendments or opting against any or all of them.

A RARE CHANCE TO SAVE \$2.00 TO \$20.00: Yes, you read it correctly. **If you pay your annual or lifetime dues before the vote on December 20th, you could save \$2.00 off your annual dues or a whopping \$20.00 off the cost of a lifetime membership.** So get that checkbook out and pay your 2007 dues early and save some bucks!! Annual dues run from 1 January through 31 December. We recommend you bring your dues to the September meeting and pay Bob Eddy who will have a "special table" just for that purpose. ACS Golf News (By Doug Nolte & Larry Knopfel)

This year marked one of the finest seasons of golf our group has ever played. We scheduled and played each week from April 20th thru October 5th (except for Belk Park which was closed after the wind and rain on July 19th) and then we scheduled two additional outings, Whitmoor Country Club and Old Hickory Country Club. Many of the courses we played were a bit upscale compared to what we did in the past and our members responded by showing up in higher numbers. On opening day at Missouri Bluffs we had our largest turnout to date when 93 golfers showed up, that was topped several times during the year and then really surpassed when we had 110 at Missouri Bluffs on October 5, 2006. Much of the success we had this year is attributed to the cooperation of our golfers who kept us apprised of the outings they would play, but more importantly our golf committee members who week in and out provided check-in processes and dealt with the many changes that occurred at the last minute. Our committee, Ed de la Pena, Dennis Terhaar, Harry Trammel, Randy Pratt, and Doug Nolte provided all the assistance that was needed to make this a very successful year. We plan to make next year another great year for golf with more new courses and perhaps small changes that will increase participation and make 2007 the best season ever.

Aerospace Charting Seniors Association Golf Outings

August 3 Gateway National: In our second visit to Gateway National, the course requested we tee off earlier than normal (0730) to get in ahead of some “preferred” customers coming on board at 1100. Lucky we did because the temperatures soared and roared before our round was completed. Two teams tied with a -7 tally; the Jeff Delaplain foursome of Avery Womack, Dave Kunz and Bill Riordan managed the same score as the Karson Kosowski group of Ed Bronczyk, Dick Sides, and Ed Stewart. In second was the John Dierker team of Paul Scheffer, Bob Touzinsky, and Bud Wamhoff. And in third place, the Jerry White threesome of Jerry, Larry Lachalmelle, and Tom Dodillet. The putting contest was won by Larry Lachalmelle, the closest to the pin shots were managed by Paul Rivard and Joe Roeder, and 4 skins were handed out to the Pratt, Kosowski, Delaplain and Torrie teams.

August 10 The Landings at Spirit: This was a new course for us and after playing it we all approved of its layout and condition. Even with the frequent touch-and-go’s by executive jets at the Spirit Airport all 82 of us thought the course worthy of play by this august group. Coming in with an astounding -10 was the Fred McGavran team of Harold Howard, Chris Cristea, and Bud Wamhoff. In second at a lofty -8 was the Doug Torrie threesome of Doug, Dennis Terhaar, and Alan Schaeffer. And two teams tied for 3rd at -6; Gayle Cattau, Dennis Dummeyer, Bob Touzinsky, and Larry Amen were in the first group and followed by Rich Battenberg, Avery Womack and Paul Scheffer. The putting contest was flooded out but the closest to the pins were awarded to Larry Knopfel and Dave Jackson. There was only one skin and that went to the Mark Hagler team.

August 17 The Orchards: A remarkable 91 golfers showed up to play at what had been one of our favorite courses, The Orchards. However, the quality of the course has gone downhill, severely. It was so bad/disappointing that we made an on-the-spot decision to take the course off our list for next year. Somehow, in spite of the conditions, we got results. Tied for first place at -8 were 2 teams, the Karson Kosowski foursome of Ron Martens, Bill Riordan, and Don Woneswith; and the Doug Nolte foursome

of Avery Womack, Larry Amen and Pierre Sans Souci. In second at -7 was the Paul Rivard team of Bob Rechten, Tom Beck and Ed Bronczyk. Three teams tied for third place at a very fine -6. The Dennis League group, the Jeff Delaplain foursome and the Ernie South foursome all came in with that score. The putting contest was captured by Bill Riordan and the closest to the pin awards were presented to Bob Franke and Tom Gill. The only skin of the day was won by the Karson Kosowski team on the hardest hole on the course.

August 24th Golf Club of Wentzville: For this outing we separated the groups into the A/B pairings and the C pairings. We do this approximately every 5th outing to give the A players a chance to play with other A players – just to see if they’re as good as they think they are. Once again the weather cooperated and we had a very successful outing of 84 players. In the A/B groupings (40 players) the winning team a -8 was the Randy Pratt foursome of Mark Hagler, Charlie Pope and Bill Neukom. After that it was 4 teams at -7, the John Dierker, Dennis League, Fred McGavran and Bob Haddad teams. In the C grouping 2 teams tied for first at -8; The Mel Meyer, Al Schaeffer, Paul Scheffer and Pierre Sans Souci Team, and the Libby Lanning, Dutch Gruenkemeyer, Bert Schott and Charlie Riedisser Team. The Dodillet and Burgherr teams tied for second at -5. Closest to the pins went to Bill Riordan on #6 (A HOLE IN ONE!!), and Ernie South on #12. Pierre Sans Souci won the putting contest.

August 31st Stonewolf: Last minute cancellations and additions brought the total for Stonewolf to 84 golfers on just a wonderful day to play – not too hot/cold, not too windy, and not too wet, just right. Stonewolf is one of the upscale courses that this group attacks during our season and it lived up to its reputation. Showing up in first place at a wonderful -9 was the Jeff Delaplain foursome of Charlie Pope, George Keil, and Don Moschenross. Two teams tied for second at a -8; Paul Pals, Harold Howard, Dutch Gruenkemeyer and Harvey Shapiro were on one team and the other was the Wayne Warneke group of Al Rosenberg, Jim Mead and Bob Kriss. Three teams tied for third at -7; the Bob Franke foursome, the Gayle Cattau group, and the Fred McGavran group all shot the -7. The putting contest was won by Rich Graeff and the closest to the pins were won by Wayne Warneke and Jerry White. The three skins went to the Delaplain, South, and Torrie teams.

September 7th Eagle Springs: The ACS group descended on the North County Recreational area

golf course with a compliment of 91 players. The weather cooperated again and the course was in quite good shape for us to hone our skills. In first place with a very nice -8 was the Bob Haddad group of Steve Dierker, Jim Lambert, and Ken Swehla. Right behind them at a -7 was the Jim Waugh foursome of Don Moschenross, Earl Phillips, and Bob Touzinsky. Two teams put up the same -6 score to finish in third place. Bob Franke's foursome of Ron Martens, Rich Graeff, and Ed Nolde was the first group at that score. Right with them was the Doug Torrie group of Harold Howard, Joe Aromando, and Pierre Sans Souci. September 14th Normandie Golf Course: This course was reportedly in pretty bad shape two weeks prior to our visit but by the time we teed off it had regained some of its old majesty and we were pleasantly surprised. Purportedly this is the oldest public course west of the Mississippi so it could stand to show some wear. Seventy-three golfers decided to take a chance on the conditions and as noted, were pleasantly surprised. In first with a very nice -5 we had two teams showing their wares. Just won skin for lowest score on a hole was awarded and it was on the 250 yard par 3 number 18, the prize going to the Jim Waugh team.

September 21st The Acorns: Ninety-three (93) golfers attended this outing at one of the pleasant courses surrounding the Waterloo, Illinois area. It was just a bit windy at this venue, but then you expect that for this course nestled in the Illinois farmland with few trees to impede the "breezes". We had two teams turn in a truly amazing -10 for first place honors. Joe Goines and his foursome of Jim Lambert, Charlie Riedisser, and Bert Schott tied with Karson Kosowski and his group of Dave Rapp, George Keil, and Al Allers. Three teams tied at -8; the Randy Pratt foursome of Dutch Gruenkemeyer, Elmer Dill, and Harvey Shapiro put up the same number as the Jerry White team of Tom Beck, John Chelonis and Joe Duran, and the Doug Nolte team of

Dallas Leavitt, Bob Eddy, and Bob Touzinsky. Two teams finished in 3rd at -7, the Ernie South team and the Walter Finke team. The putting contest was won by three gentlemen: Joe Goines, Del Meyer and Bert Schott. The closest to the pins were won by Randy Pratt and John Chelonis. The only skin was on number 8 and captured by the Randy Pratt team.

September 28th Spencer T. Olin: Cool and windy weather greeted us at this fine course outside Alton, Illinois. The course, as usual, was in very good shape and all that played enjoyed the outing at a course we'd not played in several years. The winning team came in with a very impressive -10 score. Joe Goines, Larry Lachalmelle, Joe Roeder, and Del Meyer managed this sparkling score. Next at -9 was the Wayne Lamborn team of Russ Wall, Elmer Dill, and Jerry Brown. And coming in at -7 was the Mark Hagler foursome of Ron Martens, Rich Graeff and Ed Stewart. The putting contest was won by Harold Lindahl while the closest to the pin victors were Del Meyer and Joe Roeder. We had two skins for the day; on the #6 hole the all-Italian team headed by Lou Pessoni, and the Joe Goines team on #7.
