## JUNE 2011 LUNCHEON NEWS

Forty-one ACS members and spouses attended the summer luncheon at the Viking restaurant on Jun 22, 2011. Bob Edwards led us in the pledge of allegiance and Bob Eddy said the invocation. Due to Jim Boyd's unavailability, Bob Edwards introduced our first time attendees – Gene Sylvester, Rick and Karen Levendoski, Bernie Kolo, and Bill Norman.

Larry Knopf entertained us with a few words about the golf league and a couple of memories. There is a pool of 168 golfers. To minimize misplacing the schedule, the cover is hot pink. However, a few schedules have been misplaced. Also, he and Bill Riordan were carpooling to today's luncheon and almost didn't make it. They thought it was the first Wednesday of the month and were headed to Duffy's in Kirkwood, when they realized they were supposed to be at the Viking. Larry also mentioned he and Warren Osterloh recalled taking a liberal lunch hour to go down to the Arch to see the last section of the Arch put in place. Bob Edwards commented that quite a few of the luncheon attendees weren't even in St. Louis when the Arch was completed.

Russ Wall read a message from Jim Boyd, ACS Board Chairperson on the **NGAA** status:

**“Background:** On July 30, 2010, NGA hosted a meeting with the senior officers of the three alumni associations for NGA employees (NGIAA, AMS, and ACS). NGA stated that it was interested in establishing a more formal relationship with a single alumni association. It was hopeful that the existing three associations would agree and merge to form a single NGA alumni association. This would bring continuing support and encouragement by NGA for its employees to join. This is essential for the long term existence of ACS. This initiative was voted on by the ACS membership resulting in favor of joining the NGA Alumni Association. NGIAA also voted to join, but the Association of Mapping Seniors (AMS) declined.

**June Update:** Since then, the Executive Boards of NGIAA and ACS have established a name for the organization and have worked to create a new constitution. The leads for NGIAA were Dave Burpee and Katy Smith, and the ACS leads were Jimmy Boyd and Jerry Lenczowski. The new name will be the National Geospatial-Intelligence Alumni Association or NGAA. Note the Geospatial-Intelligence is a hyphenated word. ACS will then become NGAA West.

The overall objectives are to incorporate the NGA requirements for an alumni association which represented all NGA employees while allowing NGIAA and ACS to continue operating much as they do today, as branches of the Association. The resulting constitution provides for a NGAA Board of Directors with an East chapter (currently NGIAA) and a West chapter (currently ACS). The NGAA

Board will have no direct membership and will be composed of two members from each chapter. Board officers will rotate equally among each chapter. There is a provision for other chapters to be formed.

Each member, via e-mail or USPS, received a copy of the new constitution and a ballot for voting **concur** or **non-concur by July 15, 2011.** “

**ACS BOARD POLICY  
REFUND OF RESERVATION PAYMENT**

In response to several inquires on when one can obtain a refund for luncheon reservations, the following is the ACS Board policy for sending out a refund.

### ACS GOLF NEWS 2011

**12 May Normandie Golf Club:** On a course that not many golfers like to play, we fielded 88 players on a pleasant day. The course was in decent shape with the greens being probably the best we have seen. As usual the course played long, especially the final hole which ironically is a par 3, but it's over 230 yards long, something you only see on the pro tour. One of our new members, Bill Heidbreder by name, managed to drive his ball onto the green and to finish closest to the pin. The Ron Muse team that included Jack Panula, finished in first place with a wonderful -8. In second with a -7 was a team that included Jeff Delaplain and Bob Haddad. Third place at -6 were 4 teams that included Larry Willman, Ernie South, Doug Torrie, Livingston Sykes and Bob Meinhardt. Joe McDaniels and Bill Heidbreder were among the closest-to-the-pin winners and Ed de la Peña's team won one of the skins for the day.

**19 May Wolf Hollow Golf Club:** What began as a pretty iffy day weather-wise turned into a definite bad weather day. Eleven was the largest number of holes any team played at this wonderful course near Washington, MO before the rains spoiled the day forever. We do love to play the game but there are times when intelligence actually wins out and this was one of those days.

**26 May Emerald Greens Golf Club:** This is a course set in some rolling hills of the very northeastern part of the St. Louis area, just north of the last exit in Missouri off of I-270. The course belongs to the Pipefitters Union but is open to the public at a very good rate. Unfortunately, we didn't play Emerald Greens because for the second week in a row we were rained out and did not even start the round. The golf season was beginning to get frustrating.

**2 June Bear Creek Golf Club:** With no rain in sight, we attacked the Bear Creek Golf Course on the outskirts of Wentzville. Fortunate for us the cicada invasion hadn't touched this layout. Some of us were half-deaf from the screech of these little beasties, but others didn't know what we were talking about since the pests hadn't invaded their home territory. With this discussion being part of the fare for the day, we ventured out onto the well-kept course. In first place in the A flight with a -12 was a team that included Ed de la Peña and Randy Pratt. In second place at a -10 were 2 teams that included Dennis O'Connor, John Boyd, Paul Pals, Doug Torrie and Bob Day. In third place at a -7 were 2 teams that included Joe Goines, Joe Jarvis and Ron Muse. In the B flight we had one team with a -8 that included Joe McDaniels and Harold Howard. Second place at a -7 went to two teams that included Mr. Joe Mullins. In the C flight two teams tied at -1 and those teams included Mark Hagler, Larry Knopfel, Ed Bronczyk and Bob Pankey. Three teams, with one that included Ernie South, finished at even par for a second place finish. Bob Eddy was one of the closest-to-the-pin winners.

**9 June Forest Park Golf Course:** This course reminds one of the Keystone Kops and their antics because we're constantly crossing and re-crossing certain intersections within Forest Park. The course is comprised of 3 different sets of 9-hole courses and since we play 18 we're usually relegated to the same two; the Redbud and the Dogwood courses. But because of the cart path confusion and the Keystone Kop atmosphere you could almost say we play Redwood and Dogbud on occasion. For this outing we also changed our tee box alignment so that our better players hit from further back. This didn't set too well with some of these players but somehow they made it through the round. We also used the Flight method rather than the lowest to highest score to determine winners. The Flight method creates groups of comparable ability players which today resulted in 3 different groups being rewarded for their efforts. In the A flight the Ron Muse team came out on top with a -5. Because of the playoff method for determining the winner the other teams at a -5 included such players as Joe Jarvis,

Paul Pals and John Boyd. The B flight winning team at -2 included Bob Edwards and Don Schmidt. Two teams, one of which included Jeff Delaplain, garnered second place. In the C flight, Doug Nolte was on the winning team that tallied a +3. Tying that +3, but losing in a hole playoff, was the Joe Goines team. Ed de la Peña, Randy Pratt and Jim Petraitis were on teams that shot +4, finishing in second place. In the closest to the pin category Mark Hagler and Dan Snowden were two of the winners. Only one team captured a skin for the day, the Ron Muse team.

**16 June Crescent Farms Golf Club:** Crescent Farms is the middle of 3 courses along Lewis Road off of I-44 just before the Meramec River. Last year we were severely disappointed in the condition of the course because the fairways were dirt and showed very little grass. This year the fairways came back and actually played decently. The course isn't particularly exciting but it is close and quite handy. Once again we used Flight system and came up with the following; the second place team in A flight with a -7 had Doug Torrie and Jack Eckhard as two stalwarts. Third place at a -6 went to teams captained by Paul Pals, Livingston Sykes and Don Giarraffa. In the B flight the winning team at a -4 had Randy Pratt and Livingston Lanning as two members. Another team, that included Joe McDaniels, had the same score but they were aced out in a scorecard playoff. Jack Panula, John Boyd, Ted Isringhaus, Ron Muse, Jeff Delaplain and Joe Jarvis were on teams that finished third with the same -4 score but because of the scorecard playoff were further down in the standings. In the C flight a team with Harold Howard finished first with a -3. Finishing second in C flight with a -2 was the Ed de la Peña and Larry Knopfel team. Joe Goines was on a team that posted the same -2 score but again was surpassed in the scorecard playoff. Ed de la Peña's team had one of the skins for the day.

**23 June Eagle Springs Golf Course:** 92 golfers converged on the North County recreation complex to tackle the Eagle Springs Golf course on a windy day. All 23 teams came in under par, something to be proud of, or else the course is just too easy! We had 123 birdies and just 7 bogies to round out the day. In first place with a very nice -10 was the John Boyd team that included Libby Lanning as its play-by-play commentator. In second place at a -8 was a squad that included Dan Snowden. Third place at a -7 were two teams that included such luminaries as Russ Wall and Joe Pfeifer. John Boyd had one of the closest to the pin shots, beating out fellow competitor Randy Pratt by ½ the width of a ball.

**30 June Links at Dardenne Golf Course:** On the first really warm day of the summer season we had 111 players show up at this relatively flat course just north of Hiway 40 and the Busch Wildlife area. It's nestled in a housing development and although the houses really don't come into play when we hit our golf shots, we're always aware of their presence and are mindful of hitting stray shots into backyards, or even windows. Fortunately, on this course it would take a really errant shot to impact any of the dwellings along the way. The second place team, at a very nice -8 included one of our old friends who hasn't made many outings in several years, Mr. John Chelonis. Tied with John's team were two teams that included Joe McDaniels, Bob Pankey, Larry Willman and Harold Howard. None of the ACIC, DMA, NIMA, or NGA alumni figured in the individual awards for closest to the pins or skins.

**7 July Stonewolf Golf Course:** This is one of the two jewels on the east side of the river, the other being the Far Oaks Golf Course. On this day in early July we fielded exactly 100 players to match what felt like 100% humidity. It was brutal, but as we've come to expect in this area it was only a portent of things to come. This course is one of Jack Nicklaus' specialties and it lives up to his standards as a tough but fair layout, if you stay out of the "bear" sand traps. In first place overall with a sparkling -10 was a team that included Dan Snowden. Two teams that included Paul Pals and John Boyd finished second with a great -9. Three teams that included Livingston Sykes, Tom Murphy, Don Giarraffa, and Wayne Lamborn finished in third with a -8. Bob Eddy captured one of the closest to the pin awards and the Ed de la Peña team took the only skin for the day.

**14 July New Melle Lakes Golf Course:** For one reason or another the ACS Golf Group has not played this course since 2004. Most of the holes are in sight of the

main lake in the New Melle complex and for many it makes a rather scenic venue. On this sweltering day, 90 of us felt it was not an impossible task to swing a golf club and still have fun. The course has ample, lush fairways that all seem to end with tiny, dome shaped greens that are difficult to have your ball land and stop on and at times even more difficult to putt on. One disconcerting thing about this course is the illogical lay out that causes players to double back on previously trod paths to get to the next hole in order. However, we all finished and we think played each hole in sequence. The winner for the day was the Ed de la Peña team, which managed a healthy -9 mainly on the back of Ed's display of putting. Evidently, the cups were the size of bushel baskets for him. In a distant second place with a -6 was a team that included Larry Willman. In third with a -5 was a team that included Earl Phillips and Bob Kriss. Earl Phillips, Jack Panula and Bob Eddy (again) were among the closest to the pin awardees. **21 July Belk Park Golf Course:** This is one of the better kept secrets on the east side. It's located in Belk Park on the outskirts of Bethalto, Ill. Known for its velvety, long fairways and fair greens this course has continued for years in the Post Dispatch golf edition as one of the better values in the Metro area. We weren't disappointed.
