## ACS BOARD POLICY REFUND OF RESERVATION PAYMENT

Another era has come to an end in the life of the Arsenal Mixed League. We have bowled at Shrewsbury Lanes for the last 24 years on Wednesday nights. The league voted to move to Sunset Lanes in Marlborough, just ENE of the Watson Rd. and Laclede Station Rd. intersection next season.

The only opening for the league was on Tuesday afternoons at 4:00 p.m. What a switch! When the league was formed in 1943, it was bowling on Thursdays at Esquire Bowl. According to a copy of an *Orienteer* from Oct 1949, the league was bowling at Pop Kaley's Recreation, 218 N. 7<sup>th</sup> St. In an article from the DMA News Link, 21 Apr 95, Don Reeve joined the league in 1951 and it was bowling at Londoff Lanes, just north of 12<sup>th</sup> St. & Delmar, just north of the Aero Chart Plant location.

In 1952, the Aero Chart Plant became ACIC and moved to its present location at 2d & Arsenal and the league also moved, this time, to Chip-Wa Lanes, located at Broadway & Chippewa.

The league stayed there until the 1957-58 season when it moved to DuBowl Lanes on Gravois near Grand Ave. The league bowled every Wednesday afternoon at 4:30 p.m.

During the 1961-62 season, the name of the league was changed to the Arsenal Mixed League. The league remained at DuBowl until that awful night of Jan 31, 1977 when a faulty furnace caused a fire that completely destroyed the bowling alley.

The league moved to Century Bowl to finish out the season, and moved to Western Bowl for the 1977-78 season.

In 1978 we moved to Stein Bros. Bowl on Hampton and Chippewa. We stayed there until Stein Bros. Bowl closed on Dec. 31, 1986. During the time the league was at Stein's, Century Bowl also burned.

It was at that time that the league moved to Shrewsbury Lanes. The owners of Shrewsbury were skeptical of accepting the league due to our reputation of fires at bowling alleys.

Due to her prior commitment to bowl on Tuesdays with a different group, our league is losing its wonderful and dedicated secretary/treasurer, Barb Speiser. We thank her for all her hard work these past years and wish her the best. There will always be an opening for you, Barb.
