**M**ark Twain once said everyone complains about the weather but nobody does anything about it. Since parking is a big concern at the DMA Second Street installation, here's your chance to do something about it.

With emphasis being placed on encouraging carpooling to ease parking concerns, and to provide all employees with new resources for ridesharing, the Aerospace Center Parking Committee has been in contact with RideFinders. Ridefinders is an organization that can help arrange carpools/vanpools by matching employee's zip codes and work schedules obtained from a database.

The database will contain names of DMA St. Louis employees, as well as names of individuals from private industries in the area, such as Anheuser Busch and Nooter Corp., who are interested in commuter alternatives. Funded with money provided as a result of the Federal Employees Clean Air Incentives Act,

RideFinders provides their service free of charge.

A RideFinders Commuter Survey, slated for distribution August 1, will be sent to every DMA St. Louis employee to determine interest in such a program. If interest is sufficient, employees will be automatically registered in the RideFinders commuter matching database. A free matchlist with commuters from the employee's area will be distributed at no cost.

If a carpool (two or more people sharing a ride in a personal vehicle) registers with Ridefinders, they will be guaranteed 12 rides to their car/home when they have a personal emergency or miss their carpool. RideFinders will pick up the fare.

A vanpool would have between 7-15 people sharing a ride in a RideFinders sponsored van. Passenger fares would be based on mileage and number of passengers in the vanpool. A vehicle maintenance program, insurance, emergency towing and back-up vehicles are included. The designated driver would commute for free and receive up to 300 miles per month of personal use of the van. The same guaranteed 12 free rides to car/home per year would apply as it does to carpools.

Less wear and tear on your personal vehicle, guaranteed free rides home when needed, and an easing of parking concerns—the advantages to ridesharing are many and worth consideration.

# Environmental Assessment released

*Preferred site announced for printing/distribution center*

DMA Aerospace Center Director William J. Brown and Congressman Richard A. Gephardt conducted a joint press conference July 17 at Fox High School in Arnold, Mo. The press conference was held to release for public review and comment an Environmental Assessment and Draft Finding of No Significant Impact for the proposed acquisition of a 35 acre parcel near Richardson Road in Jefferson County, Mo. The land was identified in the Environmental Assessment as the preferred site for a planned consolidation in the St. Louis area of the Defense Mapping Agency's printing, distribution, and warehousing functions.

Congressman Gephardt commented, "This is very good news for the people of Jefferson County, the people of Missouri, and it's especially good news for the workers and families of the Defense Mapping Agency here, who wanted to stay here, who are excellent employees and do a great job for U.S.

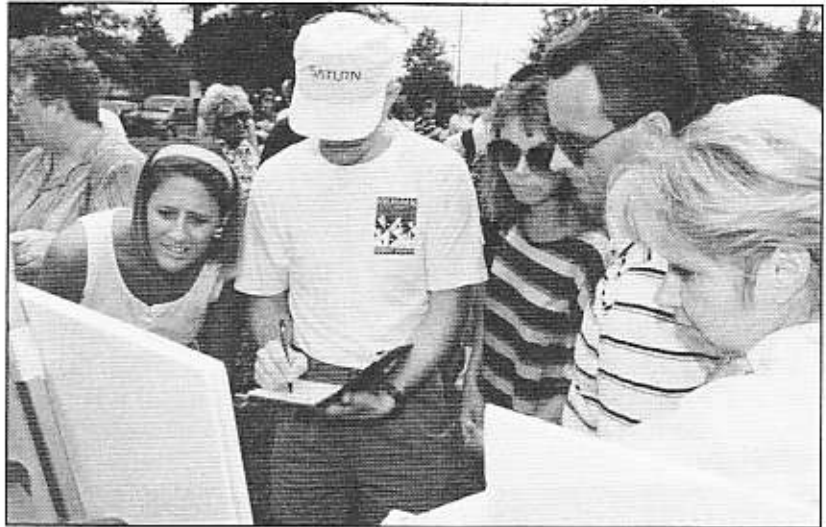
taxpayers." He then introduced AC Director Bill Brown who gave more specifics of the announcement.

The Environmental Assessment will be available for public comment for 30 days from July 17, and comments received during that time will be considered. Once the public

comment period is completed, the final decision will be made on the site selection.

If approved, construction of the new 400,000 square foot building is scheduled to begin in January of 1996 and be completed in the spring of 1998. Housed in the new facility will be approximately 600 DMA employees, most coming from DMA St. Louis, and some transferring here with the closing of certain DMA activities from three other locations: Philadelphia, Pa; and Bethesda and Riverdale, Md.

Brown closed the press conference by saying, "At a time when DMA is downsizing across the board, this planned consolidation of printing and distribution in the St. Louis area will not only save the government about \$16.6 million annually through increased efficiency, but will preserve jobs here and bring about 175 new DMA jobs to the greater St. Louis Area."

## In Memoriam

**H. Wayne Jones**, chief of the DMA St. Louis Resource Management Office (CMRA), died suddenly July 13 while attending the DMA St. Louis Leadership training conference at Cedar Creek Farm Conference Center, New Haven, Mo. The morning prior to his death Jones had briefed the senior managers at the conference on a plan to build mutual trust and understanding at all levels of the organization. "It was a subject he cared about and was deeply committed to," said AC Director William J. Brown.



Jones, a Certified Public Accountant, had been an agent for the Internal Revenue Service and was a senior accountant for a CPA firm. He came to the Aerospace Center from the Department of Agriculture in June 1980 as a systems accountant in the Finance Office.

In January 1985 Jones was appointed chief of the newly established DMA Financial Systems Office which was responsible for bringing about standardization within DMA of systems documentation of Air Force accounting systems, and designing and developing financial systems to meet DMA's unique requirements. Other positions he held at DMA St. Louis included comptroller, and most recently chief of the Finance, Cost and Economic Analysis Office before becoming chief of the Resource Management Office.

He is survived by his wife, Kathy and two sons, Timothy and Brian.

**Joy J. Strothman** died of cancer July 16. She was a financial technician in CMCAL, the Cost and Operations Support Branch of the Finance, Cost, and Economic Analysis Office. She came to the Center in June of 1968 and had 25 years of federal service.



Strothman is survived by her husband, Terry and two children, Mark and Heather. Entombment was at Mount Hope Mausoleum.

**Charles H. Andregg**, a former DMA deputy director, died of cancer July 6 in Florida. Andregg was the agency's deputy director of Management and Technology, the senior civilian post, from July 1974 until his retirement in March 1979. He began his career in mapping and charting with the Army Map Service's Louisville Field Office, holding various positions until 1962 when he went to work for the Defense Intelligence Agency as Technical Director in the Directorate for Mapping, Charting and Geodesy to participate in the planning for the development of DIA. He returned to DMA in 1972 as deputy director for Programs, Production and Operations.

Andregg is survived by his wife Helen.

# Director's Awards for 1993

*Vault Support chief developed new processes and training;  
Litho systems manager leader on unique chart projects*

**T**he Director's Awards for 1993 have been presented to **Sharon A. Degenhardt**, supervisory source data assistant in the Scientific Data Department's Vault Support Branch (SDAH), and **Melody A. Baker**, a lithographic systems specialist in the Graphic Art Department's Filmwriting and Scanning Lab (GADD).

Established in May 1987, the Director's Awards are presented quarterly and annually to recognize the most outstanding job performers. The 1993 awards are the seventh annual awards to be made. Each recipient receives \$500 and, if needed, a reserved parking space for one year.

**Sharon A. Degenhardt** received the Director's Award for 1993 in the supervisory category. As chief of the Vault Support Branch she is responsible for the operation of four vault areas. Three of the vaults are open on day shift only, while the fourth is manned 24 hrs. per day. The Branch is responsible for providing service to customers by properly processing incoming and outgoing messages and at least four different categories of Mapping, Charting and Geodesy (MC&G) source materials.

She initiated several programs during the calendar year that greatly benefit vault operations. Some of those programs include developing a training program for her second and third shift workers to expose them to day shift functions; working with Source Acquisition Segment contractors to implement automatic source shelving to inform users when the source is ready for sign-out; and coordinating with the Security Office on a procedure to use a copy of shipping manifests in lieu of addi-

tional paperwork when processing new shipments. She also instituted a new policy to cover shift replacement due to unplanned sick or annual leave.

"Sharon's leadership and managerial skills are the driving force that have maintained a high level of customer service in the vault areas. She has worked around sick and annual leave, compressed work schedule, time off for training and an increased workload to provide timely service to users of the various vaults," officials said.

**Melody A. Baker** received the non-supervisory Director's Award for 1993. As a lithographic systems manager she was responsible for transforming the Standard Index Chart (SIC) from paper hardcopy to a digital working file. Using a cartographic workstation she orchestrated the combining of product finishing techniques with specialized cartographic skills to produce a high quality product. The successful completion of the SIC provides customers a digital base for production of Space Shuttle and Chart

Update Manual products.

Baker was also responsible for the production of the digital bi-lingual chart which demanded tedious English to Portuguese translation and various format manipulations. The skills needed to complete projects of this magnitude were not available in the everyday production environment that she manages. "She researched information from department experts to devise a production plan and provided specialized training to GADD personnel to meet the deadline," officials said.

During the Yugoslavia and Somalia crises, she was the focal point for department and contractor communications which resulted in the earlier-than-scheduled completion of over 120 chart assignments.

"She has provided the critical communications between Intergraph Corporation and DMAAC in correcting critical problems associated with crisis chart production," the citation read.

# DMA 'gets in the picture' with VTC

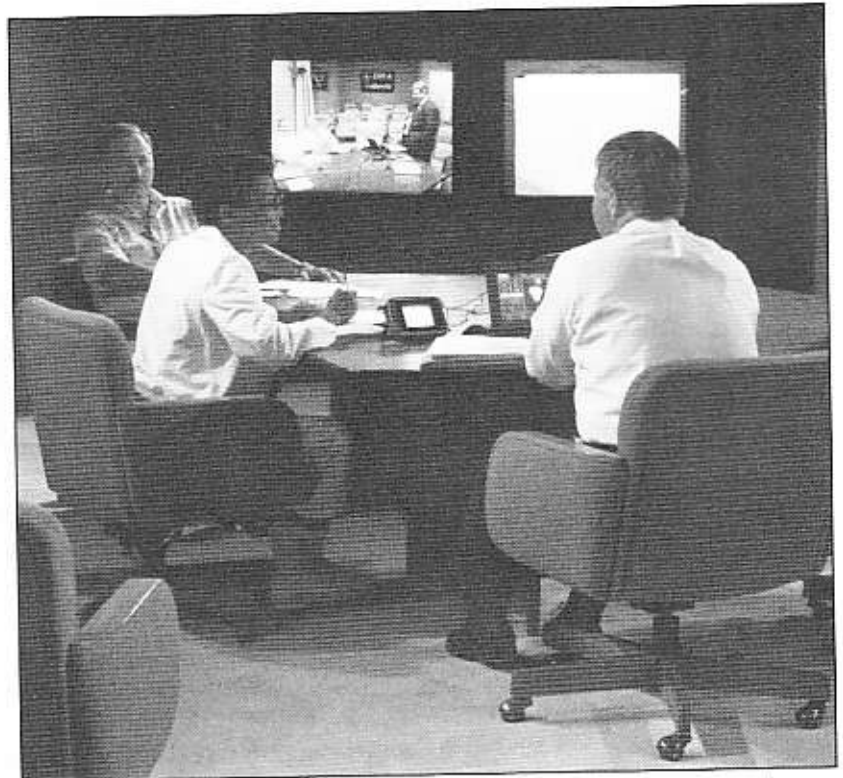
On May 1, DMA linked into the Joint Worldwide Intelligence Communications System (JWICS), thereby trading in its "Model-T" vintage conferencing system for a sleek, new vehicle for traveling the communications highways.

As budgets shrink and time becomes a more crucial element in dealing with political hot spots and unstable world conditions, DMA is seeking faster, more efficient and cost-effective methods of supporting its mission. Costlier and sometimes cumbersome traditional methods have given way to high-tech systems, like JWICS, which make optimum use of the information highways for conducting business and acquiring intelligence information.

JWICS is a complex communications network that allows for secure, high-speed multimedia transmission services for classified intelligence information. The services consist of data communications (for interactive data transfer), intelligence news broadcasts in a CNN format and video teleconferencing (VTC).

Through the JWICS network, DMA components can video teleconference with each other, Department of Defense agencies and various intelligence communities. This is an exciting change from its previous "audio" only conferencing capabilities since the VTC can also transmit hard copy graphic/written images and video recordings.

Since becoming operational, the VTC sites have logged quite a few miles. Nancy O'Dell, DMA St. Louis teleconference facilitator, said the facility averages six hours of use

per day. According to DMA's teleconference coordinator, Manuel Negron, Headquarters averages about six hours daily, which may be the result of its being the "hub" for the system.

What makes video teleconferencing so enticing? It could be the old saying, "One picture is worth a thousand words." Most seasoned negotiators or business persons know the importance of body language for sending and receiving messages, which can be a plus or minus depending on their views or ability to keep a poker face. The VTC is also a much more personable way of doing

business than over a telephone or fax machine. It transforms the name or voice on the other end of the line into a real person, and putting a name with a face can make interaction easier.

The VTC proves to be an invaluable supplement and in many cases, a viable alternative to travel. Besides avoiding travel costs, it eliminates the time spent en route, which adds up to dollars saved in terms of productivity.

In addition to those benefits, there are the greatly appreciated "side effects." Meetings usually start and end on time. "The VTC is being used



a lot and DMA is getting its money's worth," said Negron. "It makes meetings easier and they're probably shorter because people are aware of the time constraints."

There's little doubt that the VTC has changed and continues to change the way DMA does business, according to officials. However, there are times and situations when video conferencing is not appropriate and only "face-to-face" contact will get the job done better. When a site visit is not essential, a video conference may be the prudent way to go and the question, "To VTC or not to VTC?" may arise.

As popularity and availability increase, VTC use is becoming more innovative, branching out from the typical meeting scenario to meet mission needs and requirements. An example of this is video teletraining (VTT) used by DMA's Atlantic Office, a Combat Support Center element, at Norfolk Naval Air Station, Va. The pilot program instituted in April, conducts weekly customer training seminars centered on the use of DMA catalogs, requisitioning procedures and crisis support. Historically, personnel from the Atlantic Office made two to four trips annually to provide support to commands outside its geographic area.

Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Paul R. Saligas, VTT organizer said the trips were not adequate to reach all customers who wanted or needed the training. As a result of the VTT, more customers are being served and TDY costs are minimized. "Customer feedback was overwhelmingly positive," said Atlantic Office commander, Navy Cmdr. William F. Perdue.

Army Col. James R. Nichols, commander of the Defense Mapping School, Fort Belvoir, VA., said a plan is in the works for similar video teletraining at the school. "As budgets get smaller, new ways for meeting the customer's needs while

reducing travel costs is necessary," said Nichols.

DMA uses the VTC for its weekly directors' meetings between HQ and its components. It's also being used for special events like "DMA Kids Day" where children at HTC talked to kids at HQ and St. Louis. Barring system capability and organization policy, VTC use is limited only by the creativity of the user.

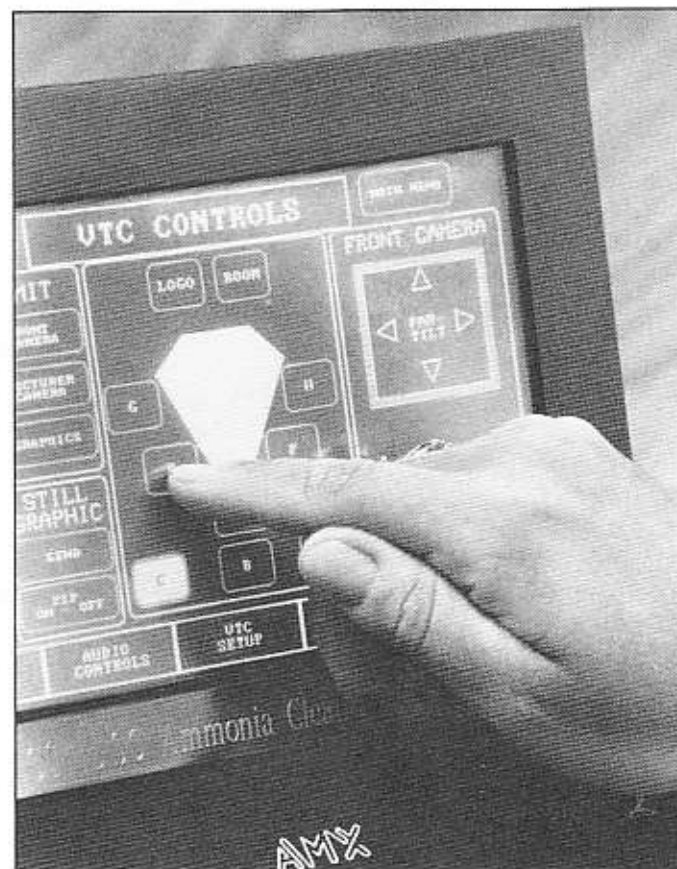
DMA's video teleconferencing system and master schedule is controlled through the Systems Center at HQ. Any employee who wishes VTC information or to schedule an event should contact Vivian Washington or Debra McLaurin at 703/285-9536.

Reservations for location and time are on a first-come first-served basis.

The meeting host is responsible for notifying VTC participants of the time and place and only the host may cancel a reservation.

Some people shy away from the video conference because they are uneasy with change, especially when it involves interacting with technology vs. people. It's the, "I hate talking to a machine phobia." Most users agree that the VTC isn't anything like that. "It's just like the person is sitting across the table from you. It's user friendly—very comfortable," are most users' comments.

The next time you get ready to fill out that Request/Authorization for Travel, ask yourself—To VTC or not to VTC? The answer may be only a phone call away.

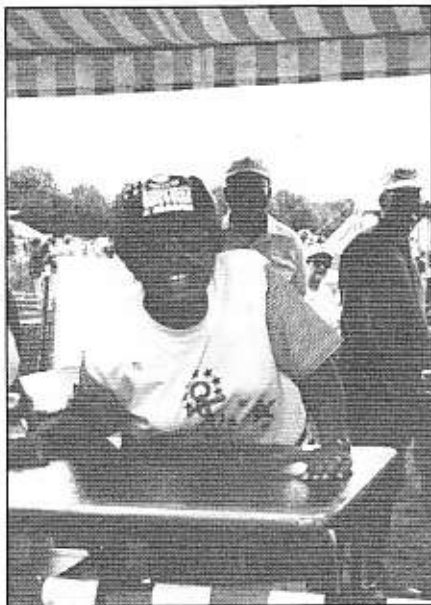
